Street drinkers update

Local residents have reported to the police, that there has been a reduction of street drinkers in the area since the Directed Patrol Activity has been in place. The DPA, carried out by Crawley police officers and PCSOs, will continue in the areas of Three Bridges where the street community congregate.

If these people are caught drinking alcohol, or even if they are in possession of alcohol, it is seized and disposed of; they are given a Section 27 which orders them to leave the area; if they return within the time stated by the officer (normally 12 hours) they will be arrested. Police and the council have been trying to get the land owner to clean up the tented area (near Haslett Avenue East) and evict the people staying there, then to secure the land. Dates have yet to be confirmed.

Action day in Three Bridges

On 17 September the police held an action day in Three Bridges. The main reason was to stop people cycling on the footpaths. The numbers of cyclists stopped and spoken to are still being collated and will be available in the very near future.

Arrests

Two search warrants, issued by the Law Courts, were carried out by police officers in Three Bridges for the mis-use of drugs; someone was arrested at each address.

'Boy racer'

A warning has recently been issued to a young driver, who was acting in an anti-social manner whilst driving his car in Tesco's car park. The warning is officially known as a Section 59; if the offender is caught again the vehicle can be seized by the police.

Three Bridges officers will continue to actively patrol this area.
